Hence, we've rounded up a couple of new restaurants or places to eat in Seminyak which we were eyeing on but didn't manage to visit – but you can.

1. Tiffin Bali



Calling themselves an Indian-inspired kitchen that serves wholesome curries and sharing plates – tapas-style – Tiffin Bali has recently changed its status from a pop-up to an official restaurant. Reviews of the place have been raving and many recommend the fish curry, prawn Tadka skewers and the Kheema samosas (hot!).
